Then Get Hands-On...

Suit up & go hands-on with me to inspect a working honeybee colony!

You choose how involved you want to be. Watch the bees at work raising their young and storing honey. Pass a live frame around for a closer look and take your turn searching for the queen bee. She can be hard to spot!

All protective gear is provided and makes for a great bee suit selfie to share your adventure on social media.

What should I wear? We want you to be completely safe and comfortable during your special experience so please wear light clothing or shorts and a t-shirt. You will be completely covered in our special white ventilated beekeeping suits. Please make sure to wear socks with closed in shoes.

What do I need to bring? All you need to bring is your sense of fun and adventure! Plus a large bottle of water (to keep hydrated) and your phone for taking lots of pictures!

[SEP] Optional: If you're brave enough, you will then put on an actual bee suit, the same suits beekeepers wear, and take a short walk to live bee hives. These hives are bustling with

thousands of bees coming and going. Our Beekeeper will then open a hive and show you actual honey and honey combs. You'll see live bees at work !

Note: There is always a chance of being stung even with bee suits on. If you're allergic to bee stings DO NOT come on any of our workshops.

Workshop begins on time. Please be at our location 10-15min before your tour .

We recommend that anyone attending not wear any perfume or hair spray or highly scented deodorant or creams. We have never had a problem with anyone being stung, but scents can confuse the bees and encourage them to buzz around the highly scented individual, a bit more than they would if there was no scent. Bees also don't like things that are really shiny or the smell of bananas.
